



THEO YEAR OF FAITH 2013 TOKOS


Through our Parish registration system, we try to keep an up to date list of all the members of our Parish family, which includes contact and mailing information. At a very practical level, it allows us to mail out receipts for donations each year, as well as invitations for events such as our Parish Appreciation Dinner. And at a more spiritual level, it tells us who identifies themselves as Parishioners, and thus able to participate in the Sacramental life of the Parish.

Both aspects are important, of course, the latter being so due to the realities of our Parish: we share the same boundaries with St. Jacques, St. Marguerite d'Youville, and Notre Dame du Rosaire. It is important to know which Parish a Roman Catholic belongs to, as it is there in which their rights and obligations are exercised. Canon Law, by the way, spells out those rights and obligations in a series of Canons which form, in essence, a constitutional framework for believers called "The Obligations and Rights of All Christ's Faithful". Basically, they stipulate that all Catholics are obligated to lead a holy life, at a bare minimum by keeping the precepts of the Church (attend Mass every Sunday, observe prescribed fast days, financial support, etc.). The corresponding rights of such Catholics are that they be provided with all the spiritual supports (Sacraments, etc.) necessary to live a life of holiness. The Canons themselves spell all these out and, perhaps I'll dedicate another article to them one day.

For now, I'm simply illustrating why it is important for us to have up to date registration information. When I'm asked to provide a Sacrament such as Baptism, I can only do so when the person is a member of this Parish. The Bishop has given me the authority to provide such spiritual care only to the members of this community. Exceptions are made in cases of emergency, of course, but in the normal course of events, my pastoral authority extends only to the Parishioners of St. Kevin.

This brings us to our Parish registrations, of which I am assuming everybody has undertaken by now. In fact, we have 750 registrations recorded. That number, however, may be a bit deceptive, as those registrations include all the data carried forward from an older registration program from both our previous parishes. There are, no doubt, a number of people included who have moved away or who no longer consider themselves Parishioners of St. Kevin. Due to this reality, last weekend I mailed a letter to 200 people with whom we have had no contact for at least one year. I simply asked them to contact us and let us know if they do, in fact, wish to continue being a member of this Parish.

I tried to remove from this list, to the best of my ability, those who are, in fact, at Church on Sunday. I know, for example, that some of you do not use donation envelopes, but make financial contributions in other ways. I had a number of parish leaders assist me in going through the names on that list, to remove those of you in that situation. Still, you may have received a letter this week, despite our best efforts. Please, don't be concerned. Just give the office a call, and let Trudy know you are here. I am trying to be as respectful as possible of everyone's wishes, while keeping our list up to date. This will be an annual exercise, but I do hope to get better at it as we go forward, and as I get to know everyone here a little bit better.



PARISH WEB SITE:

Everyone is reminded that our Parish Web Site is available as a source of information for you and your friends. It has up to date information about all our Parish events (Calendar Page). The Parish bulletin is posted there, as are all weekend homilies.

Newly posted is a video Fr. Michael produced of last Tuesday's Confirmation celebration.

It can be found under our Photo Album Tab. During the summer months, when the Parish Bulletin is not published, the Calendar Page will still provide up to date information about the Mass schedule and other Parish events.
