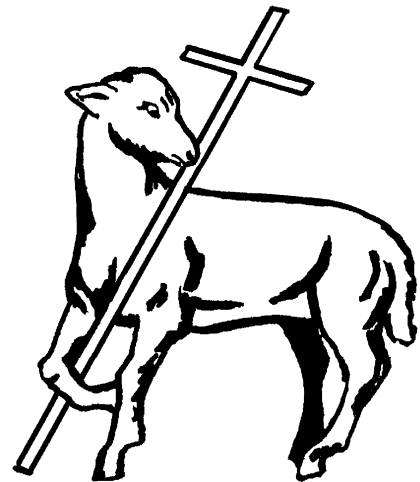

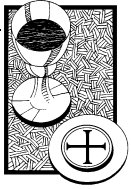

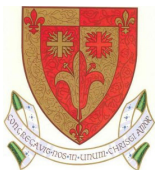

REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP CORNER

An edited update from our official report:

After three months, all the family members have been actively learning English, and have attended appointments at doctor, dentist, optometrist and immunization clinic (multiply 9X4 and add follow-ups to get an idea of how busy it is!). Six of the seven children are in school and the seventh attends Best Start program. This winter saw the children skating, skiing, swimming, and enjoying Science North, as well as some less formal activities. They look forward to soccer and swimming this summer. Older ones are trying out for school teams, earning volunteer hours, and seeking summer jobs. The parents have been taking English language lessons in Sudbury twice a week, and have been working on English at home with volunteers. The father has been successful in the written portion of the driving test and will soon do the road test. The family has made some connection with the two mosques that are in Sudbury. Much generosity has come from individuals and organizations. As spring dawns (slowly) upon us, we are acquiring, from various sources, boots, umbrellas, splash suits, soccer equipment, bikes/helmets and other spring/summer supplies. They look forward to planting garden plots. There are still many ways that people can help (**drivers are needed, occasionally people to meet the school bus, helpers with English instruction**). Some people may wish to offer outings or odd jobs to family members. In this case, it is very important to communicate directly with the parents for permission and with Laurie Jones (who is the main integration co-ordinator, responsible for managing schedules, drivers, translators, and appointments). As sponsors, it is our responsibility to make sure that with any offers of work, there is assurance of safety, fair remuneration, and a respect of the person's dignity. Newcomer parents have made unimaginable sacrifices to bring their children to Canada, and it is understandable if the whole experience is a bit overwhelming at times to young and older. We really have been blessed to have in our community the Alzahrn family who are working hard to make a new life here, and sharing with us their grace, humour, and hospitality.
