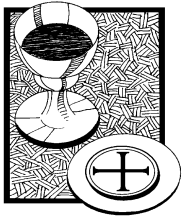

MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION NEEDED - CAPREOL:

Those who worship at Our Lady of Peace Site are asked to consider the possibility of serving as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Eucharist there on Sunday mornings. A few of our volunteers have recently had to resign from their ministry, and we need to replace them. The alternative, which we do not wish to choose (but will need to without more ministers) is to refrain from offering Communion from the Chalice at that Mass.

For just over a week, we Roman Catholics have been living through the unique ‘sede vacante’ brought about by the moving to a life of prayer and meditation of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. It has certainly captured the attention of the world. There have been news reports, articles, editorials and blogs that can be characterized as being everything from brilliantly insightful (see some of the links on our Website, for example) to low level garbage, or worse. All to be expected, of course, and indicative of the world’s continued fascination with our Lord Jesus Christ and the Church He established, with Peter as the rock.

Through it all, faithful Roman Catholics have really only one task at hand: to pray. We are called upon to pray for the Cardinal Bishops who have been tasked with the duty of discerning God’s will. God, of course, has already chosen our next Holy Father. It is the task of prayer, then, to discern that choice and to make it evident through the various protocols that have been established for the election.

In a few weeks, we will have a new ‘Peter’ established by Jesus as the rock against which even the gates of hell will not prevail. There is certainly comfort in that knowledge, especially as the gates of hell seem terribly close, at times. Whoever it is, he will be given the responsibility of steering the Church through tumultuous times (have they ever been otherwise?) in faithfulness to the teachings of Jesus. That faithfulness guarantees that the teachings concerning the ‘pelvic centric’ issues of the Western world’s media (ever notice that the world focuses on that one body zone, when the Church is concerned far more with peace, love, justice and hope?), will not be swept away. The Church is not concerned with opinions, trends, customs or fads. It is concerned only with the Truth that it has received from our Lord. Abortion, artificial forms of contraception in Marriage, Marriage in a form other than one man and one woman, or any expression of sexuality outside that relationship of Marriage – all have been revealed by our Lord as contrary to our human dignity and a poison to our humanity. They lead to death, not life, and the Truth thus revealed cannot be changed by any man, or woman, and most certainly not by the Pope (maybe by the Supreme Court of Canada, but that’s another story!).

None of this matters to faithful Catholics, of course, but it forms part of hell’s fury that rages around us, and it is prudent to be aware of it, even as we hold fast to the promise of God’s faithfulness in His Church. A ‘sede vacante’ is a unique experience to live through, and none more unique than this one. It is a time of excitement, taking place in the middle of this Year of Faith, during which each of us is called to enter into a deeper Communion with the Lord. In our prayers for the Church at this time, we can ask for the grace to be open to the will of God for ourselves (“speak Lord, your servant is listening”), even as we pray for that openness on the part of those now listening to God as He reveals His choice to them.
