**THEO** **TOKOS**  
YEAR OF FAITH 2012-2013

In the great Liturgical traditions of the Church, we might this day declare to one another a joyful “Christ is Risen!” to which the reply would come from those around “Truly He is Risen!” It is a simple exultation shared between believers who have experienced Jesus in a personal way, not as one slain, but as one alive and calling us to life. One of my favourite icons depicts Jesus in the depths of hell, taking Adam and Eve each by the hand and leading them to Paradise. It is an echo of our Creed when we state “He descended into hell” and is a wonderful reminder of one of my favourite Easter homilies, dating from the earliest days of the Church. It is part of the Office of Readings on Holy Saturday and reads in part:

**“God has died in the flesh and hell trembles with fear. He has gone to search for our first parent, as for a lost sheep. Greatly desiring to visit those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death, He has gone to free from sorrow the captives Adam and Eve, He who is both God and the son of Eve. The Lord approached them bearing the cross, the weapon that had won Him the victory. At the sight of Him Adam, the first man He had created, struck his breast in terror and cried out to everyone: ‘My Lord be with you all.’ Christ answered him: ‘And with your spirit.’ He took him by the hand and raised him up, saying: ‘Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead, and Christ will give you light.’**

**“I am your God, who for your sake have become your son. Out of love for you and for your descendants I now by My own authority command all who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are in darkness to be enlightened, all who are sleeping to arise. I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of My hands, you who were created in My image. **Rise, let us leave this place.**”**

I hope and pray that, during the great Season of Lent through which we have travelled, we each have left a little hell behind and have been raised up closer to the love of God which is real and active in our lives and in our world. It doesn’t take much – the little things matter. Our tone, our hands open rather than clenched, a smile of welcome, a heart that delights in little joys, an attitude that allows for the possibility of God’s light in even the worst darkness, a peace that the world cannot take away. The stone has been rolled back. Death has been trampled by death. Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen! Alleluia.
