



MONEY TALK

A few weeks ago, Mark Patterson, the chair of our Financial Committee, spoke to parishioners of St.Kevin's Parish, about the financial condition of our parish. He explained the challenges we face, due in large part to a decrease in donations over the past few years and thro Covid, and an increase in the cost of maintaining & operating our buildings. For 2023, we are projecting a shortfall of \$60,000, based on our day-to-day expenses; the budget does not take into consideration any extras monies needed for large repair projects.

A big thank you to all the parishioners who came forward after Mark's talk, and who were interested in helping with fundraising. An initial meeting of the group has already been held to brainstorm & discuss implementation of some fundraising ideas. In the near future, they will be reaching out to you, our parishioners, and asking for your help. See the list of committee members and our first projects on next page. In the past, only the income for each month has been shared on an on-going basis. In order to better keep parishioners informed of what this actually means in terms of our financial condition, the income will be shared quarterly (instead of monthly), and it will be compared to the budget for the same period. Below is information for the 1st quarter of 2023.

Apron Strings

here are moments when we realize the baton has been passed to us, and now we must conduct the symphony of our lives. One such moment may be when both parents have died. "They" say we never fully grow up until that occurs, for from that time on we can no longer go home. I know of a daughter who received a gift from her mother when the daughter moved out on her own. Inside, the daughter discovered a pair of apron strings, a symbol of her break with home. At various times, life hands us a bountiful serving of responsibility as we commit to a vocation, or for many, become parents for the first time. On such occasions, the future may weigh heavily upon us.

This week's Gospel is a farewell speech of sorts. Given to the Twelve on the night before his passion and death, Jesus promises he will not leave us orphans and that the Spirit will be given to us to do what we must do.

There have been any number of times when life has unfolded for me into new circumstances and life roles, occasions often filled with anxiety and sometimes even fear. I usually found I could deal with such realities by asking myself what would be the worst that could happen, and if it did, could I handle it? Every time, I found myself realizing I could handle the worst. Importantly, the ability to do what needs doing always seems to flow from God's Spirit that is given to each of us. If our faith in God is alive in us, our spiritual apron strings are never severed.
