

Office Closed in July & August



CN Railroaders in the Community Program

What is CN Railroaders in the community? It is a program that supports the volunteer efforts of CN employees, their family members, CN retirees and the spouses/surviving spouses of CN retirees. The program provides rewards to the community-based charitable organizations for whom these individuals volunteer. St.Kevin's Parish qualifies as an eligible charity.

Please encourage your CN family members and friends to sign up this program. Here's why:

- CN employees still working can submit up to 216 hours per year (including volunteer hours submitted by other family members); this could generate up to \$3240 for their charity.
- Pensioners can submit up to 150 hours per family (including hours submitted by their spouse/surviving spouse); this could generate up to \$2,250 for their charity.
- Bonus: If you are a contributing member of the Canadian National Pensioners Association (paying your \$1 per month membership), CN will give an additional reward of \$100 to one of the charities you volunteer for. How easy is that!

More Information:

- You can still submit hours for as far back as January 1 2023, and can continue to submit until December 31st, for benefits in the current year.
- Volunteer work must be on behalf of the church, or an associated 'outreach' group such as the CWL. Do you attend meetings? Knit mitts for the needy? Help set up for celebrations? Perform volunteer maintenance work? If you are not sure if your volunteer work qualifies, or want further clarification please give Gail a call.
- You can choose to submit your hours through Gail Crawford, or you could set yourself up and submit your own hours. There are detailed instructions on setting yourself up on the CN pensioners website www.cnpensioners.org, CN Community tab. Gail is also willing to assist anyone who wants to set themselves up.

As of May 10th we had 10 members signed up & are waiting for receipt of our first payment for their volunteer hours!

We pray to the Lord.



Food for the Day

ust as the darkest of nights brings out stars we might never notice otherwise, so is it that when we find ourselves lost in the dark of life's deserts, the slightest kindnesses can bring us to a brief oasis in a day otherwise oppressive. Most often such moments come as gifts, unearned—even undeserved. Yet they are blessings to us.

Psychologists tell us that if we find ourselves down in the dumps and depressed, we can find hope by naming three things that happened that day that were pure gifts—a phone call from a friend, a compliment, a free cup of coffee, a good bill of health from the doctor. Remembering them at the end of the day and giving thanks for them may not solve the issues that burden us, but they can put them in perspective, reminding us that life is a mix of both the good as well as the not so good.

Moses urged the people to recall all that God had done for them—bringing them out of Egypt, guiding them through the desert, leading them to water, and feeding them with manna. Amid their grumbling, their remembering offered them hope and the courage to go on.

Thus, what psychologists suggest is what God has been doing for us for thousands of years—that God feeds us daily in large and small ways, all without our deserving it but out of his great generosity. Remember, then, how God has fed you.
