



MONEY TALK

In this bulletin you will find a financial report covering the period January 1st to June 30th 2023. The report compares actual income & expenses to the budgeted amounts for this period.

The report shows parishioners gave \$4442 more than budget through the collection basket. This was augmented with additional income from Funerals, a SK Knights of Columbus donation & Fundraising through the CN volunteers in the community program. However when taking into account the additional \$30,000 that would be needed this period to meet expenses (based on the 2022 shortfall), our income as compared to budget is still \$12,595 short as of June 30th.

In the expenses section, we have spent \$14,477 more than was budgeted for this period. At St. Kevin's we had a leak in the hall, which was mostly covered by insurance. At OLP, additional expense were incurred related to the foyer water damages. Natural Gas expenses are way up at both locations.

The combination of the \$12,595 income short fall, and \$14,477 expense overage, have resulted in a net shortage of \$27,072 as compared to the budget for the period Jan 1st to June 30th.

Things to be aware of when reading the report:

- * The DAE is the amount we pay the Diocese to support our parish & is based on last year's income. This year we pay \$2000 per month
- The actual overage or shortfall for the year can only be known at yearend when all entries for the year have been entered. This report is intended to provide a high level (not detailed) estimation of how we are doing as compared to the budget approved by the Financial Committee.
- The timing of the receipt of income/expenses can slightly skew the comparison to budgeted amounts, when reported on mid-year. This is resolved at year end.
- We have already raised money at both the recent family bbq & the yard sale but these amounts will not be reflected until the next quarterly report which will include Jan Sept 2023.
- Our license to work at the Delta Bingo & Gaming & raise funds for the church is fully approved, and the teams of volunteers have been set up we expect to be working at bingos starting in October. The monies raised will be reflected in a future report, in the quarter in which the church is paid.

Tweaked by God

hile the Scripture readings this week remind us we are responsible for one another, do any of us really want someone serving as our conscience, telling us what to do? A national insurance company once aired a TV ad in which "Cynthia" takes it upon herself to make sure everyone was abiding by the established regulations of the subdivision. She checks to make sure everyone is breaking down cardboard, cuts down hanging flower baskets that are contrary to regulations, and takes a chainsaw to mailboxes that are even two inches too high.

None of us want a "Cynthia" for a neighbor. It may be that it takes a community to raise a child, but once we have become adults—well, thanks but no thanks. So what do we do with these readings?

The Gospel adds the ingredient of community to the "cake batter." Praying with a faith community can help correct our personal opinion, remind us what we might be blind to, and broaden our vision by affirming that we are a part of a larger world, all from the perspective of faith.

A faith community that reflects "Cynthia" thinking is a church that seeks to control. It motivates by fear, discourages prayerful reflection, and expects everyone to march in unison. A healthy faith community is a church that respects everyone as serious individuals of faith, encourages study and dialogue to seek out truth, and recognizes that growth in faith occurs in different ways. Prayerful, respectful communities of faith are how God tweaks our lives.
