Dear Parishioners,
As you know, both churches of the Parish of St Kevin's have undergone some extensive and expensive repairs over the past year or so. While some of this was covered by our insurance, most was not. The foyer repairs that are nearing completion at Our Lady of Peace cost the parish over $\$ 120,000$ and the new rooftop furnaces that were needed at St Kevin's site cost the parish close to $\$ 70,000$. Some of these costs were covered by withdrawing from our savings accounts (which are rapidly dwindling) and some were covered by a low interest loan from the Diocese. Future capital investments must also include addressing the deterioration of the bell tower at OLP.
Due to these rising capital costs, the Finance Committee requested permission from the Diocese to raise money for the purpose of recouping some of the capital costs already expended, and for the monies raised to be exempt from the Diocesan Administrative Expense (DAE) of $15 \%$. The Parish has received approval to raise up to $\$ 140,000$ over the next 3 years. $100 \%$ of monies raised under this DAE exemption will stay here, in the parish, and are eligible for a tax receipt. These exempt monies can be raised through fundraising activities, and/or an additional collection for this purpose can be established. The Finance Committee believes both are important.
The CN Employee program and the volunteer hours worked at Delta Bingo \& Gaming should continue to generate some good income, but we will need to continue with additional fundraisers as well, to raise monies under this exemption. The next Fundraising Meeting will be Wednesday May 8th, and all are welcome to attend.
The exempt monies can also be raised by establishing an additional collection for the stated purpose of recovering the capital costs incurred. The Finance Committee has also chosen this option. To identify this collection, green 'Building Fund Offering' envelopes have been purchased, and will be placed in the pews, and at the back of both church buildings. A donation can be made at any time of the year \& any amount will help towards the ultimate goal; these envelopes can be placed in the collection basket at any mass, or delivered to the office.
We will keep a running total of monies raised to-date and share that information via the bulletin at regular intervals, so we can see the progression to our ultimate goal. I'm sure with your generosity, it can be achieved!

* 'The DAE is a levy set by the Bishop of the Diocese of Sault Ste.Marie, following Canon 1263, to help meet the needs of the diocese in its mission of proclaiming the Gospel.' The funds provide staff, resources and programming to support the churches in our Diocese. Collection envelopes such as 'Sunday', 'Heat', 'Easter', 'Christmas' \& 'New Years' are all subject to the DAE of $15 \%$ of monies collected.

## Living with Our Instincts

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

We live with a maze of instincts-some from the dark side and some from the light. In her book Caste, Isabel Wilkerson describes how cultures tend to consign certain individuals to the bottom of the social ladder. She specifically compares the caste system in India with how the Nazis sought to suppress and eliminate Jews and with the way blacks were oppressed by slavery and even in our own time. She describes the instinct in every society to relegate others to a lower class, always seeking to ensure that we are not at the bottom. This instinct can come from the dark side of people.

There is also an instinct for goodness to others, an instinct of light-to recognize everyone as brothers and sisters. As Saint John notes, "we are God's children now"
(1 John 3:2). It is the voice of the Shepherd instilled in the human spirit that calls us into one fold, the voice of God urging us to healing goodness.

It is the dark side that nurtures white supremacy. It is the light that enables us to see beyond the color of our skin. It is the dark side that excludes those who seem different. It is the light that welcomes and offers hospitality. It is the dark side that succumbs to fear. It is the light of God's love that confronts the wolves of hate and urges us to follow. There is always tension between darkness and light.
